

IPR Acts in India

- **Patents** : The Patents Act, 1970 as amended in 1999, 2002 and 2005
- **Design** : The Designs Act, 2000
- **Trade Mark** : The Trade Marks Act, 1999
- **Copyright** : The Copyright Act, 1957 as amended in 1983, 1984, 1992, 1994, 1999 and 2012
- **Layout Design of Integrated Circuits** : The Semiconductor Integrated Circuits Layout Design Act, 2000
- **Protection of Undisclosed Information** : No exclusive legislation exist but the matter would be generally covered under the Contract Act, 1872
- **Geographical Indications** : The Geographical Indications of Goods (Registration and Protection) Act, 1999
- **Plant Varieties** : The Protection of Plant Variety and Farmer's Right Act, 2001.
